This study analyzed the relationship of tradition, religion, and politics the government's efforts to overcome the COVID-19 Pandemic emergency in Indonesia. Indonesia failed to break the COVID-19 Pandemic transmission chain, which has begun to spread since March 2, 2020, partly because there is a relationship of tradition, religion, and politics that is not in line with the government's program as the emergency response to the COVID-19 pandemic. In this case, first, Indonesia was proud of being able to detect COVID-19 patients. The government has not had the chance to consider that the COVID-19 transmission will be uncontrolled and deathly in Indonesia as today. As of August 16, 2020, in Indonesia, 137,468 patients were treated, reaching 6,071 deaths, and 91,321 recovered [1]. This trend shows an increase in the number of COVID-19 patients after the government announced a new standard policy. The public has interpreted it as a return to the traditional life era by ignoring health protocols[2].

The Indonesian government has begun to earnestly implement the program as an emergency response to the COVID-19 pandemic since a state official, Budi Karya Sumadi, the Minister of Transportation, was early detected as a positive patient infected
